TRANSFORMING MINDS AND HEARTS

IN ROMANIA

As manager of Grace Christian School in Lagoj, Romania, Emanuel Olariu '08 has seen the power of lives transformed through Christian education. He helped start the school with just 32 students after graduating from Bethel. Nine years later, the school has grown to 430 students – from preschool to eighth grade – and 80 staff members.

Grace Christian School is the only private school in Lagoj and is accredited by the Romanian Ministry of Education. They focus on academic excellence from an evangelical Christian perspective. Some of the most influential families in Lagoj send their children to Grace. But, Olariu emphasizes, this is not the school's goal.

"Our main goal is to introduce Jesus to each child and parent

that comes our way. Our mission is to create the best environment so that the children that God entrusted to us can grow spiritually, intellectually, physically and socially."

So far, Olariu has not turned any child away, and about onethird of students receive some sort of financial assistance.

"I started this project praying that God would help us give a chance for a better education to any parent who wants to educate their child in an institution that is founded, guided and motivated by Christian principles," Olariu explains.

He relies on God's provision to make budget each month. Half of operational costs are covered by tuition; the rest by generous sponsors.

"This project was and continues to be a miracle [and] it is impossible not to associate it with faith," Olariu says.

Renovations are nearing completion on an old Catholic school that will become the middle school. His next big project is the exterior, which will require significant funding. Olariu also has dreams of building a high school and someday, even a college.

"Education does not only open doors, it also opens minds," Olariu says. "Christian Education can open the doors of Heaven for the students of Lugoj," says Olariu.

and improve the lives of those that come into contact with this project," Olariu says. "I never dreamed this dream would become a Christian school." Olariu grew up on the mission field in Romania, which is still recovering after 50 years of communist oppression. He watched his father, who served as the director of Percept Ministries in Eastern Europe, plant churches, build buildings, start a kindergarten and begin renovations on the old Jewish school that would become Grace Christian School.

It was through Percept Ministries that Olariu first heard about Bethel College, when Professor Dennis Engbrecht, Ph.D., led a Bethel task force team to assist in the construction of the Euro Asia Precept Ministries Bible Training Center.

Olariu came to Bethel to study business administration, but added another major in economics and finance because of the impact Associate Professor Aaron Schavey, Ph.D., had on him.

"Studying business, I realized the importance of a long-term investment and I understood that this is what a school really is ...

It all started with a group text.

Yonathan Moya '10 and his six siblings, who all attended Bethel, were discussing their feelings about Mexican culture and immigrants in January.

"We're a first-generation Mexican family," said Moya, a liberal arts major, who was born in Mexico, but migrated with his family to south Texas in the early 1990s. "All of us felt really weighed down, and I threw an idea out there and said: I wonder what it would be like if people that have never been to the border ... actually had a conversation with someone there."

Within a month, Moya, along with his brother, Jordan, set off for a nine-day photographic journey along the U.S.-Mexican border to Texas, New Mexico, Arizona and California. They titled their trip "Border Perspective."

"I think as storytellers, we have the ability to connect people to others, and that's what I wanted to do with Border Perspective," said Moya about sharing the story through photography.

Moya felt that if they could humanize the people they met on the border, connections could be made with the people in their Midwestern states of Indiana and Minnesota.

The two met all sorts of people – from an elderly gentleman who works in cornfields every summer in Elkhart, to a little league team in El Paso that plays in fields right along the border, to a retired nurse who washes the feet of the immigrants weekly.

Through the trip, Moya perceived that people choose to live a normal life in these violent, heavily surveilled areas. He also gathered from his experience that amidst an increase in crime, a change he noted from his days growing up along the border, there are those who empathize with the immigrant population.

"People have the same compassion for the immigrant as maybe people [in the Midwest] have for the homeless," said Moya.

Although Border Perspective isn't the typical mission trip, the

desire to connect and serve those in need was instilled in Moya at Bethel. He first went on a Hong Kong taskforce trip and later a Hurricane Katrina task force trip in Louisiana. He then began volunteering

with the non-profit Experience Mission, where he now works as the Regional Coordinator.

And it was the Missionary Church that brought Moya to Bethel in the first place.

"My dad literally sent me away to Bethel because of the history and experience that he had [as a pastor] with the Missionary Church," he said.

Moya also developed a passion for photography in a digital photography class at Bethel, a passion he translated into Border Perspective by putting together a mini-documentary of the trip. Eventually, the brothers plan to host gallery-installments in

Minneapolis, Minn., showcasing the stories and photos of the experience.

While the trip had a finite life, Moya knows nine days wasn't enough to tell all the stories of the people who span the length of the border

"I feel now that we could spend nine days in just one

place along the border," said Moya.

Despite the emotional toll the trip has taken on him, Moya and his brother are planning to return to the border within the next year.

"God is demanding more and more love and a balanced view and perspective of me," said Moya. "I think this trip kicked that off in a very healthy way."

Bethel hosted thousands of elementary, middle and high school students over the summer months for a variety of activities. These included hosting the Missionary Church Central District's Youth Conference (CDYC), pictured, top left; Summer of Service (SOS), pictured, top right, an annual outreach event for local youth groups; the Sycamore Drum Major and Leadership Clinics; and Bethel's annual academic camps and sports camps.

Hispanic Student Day Brings 350 to Campus 4

On May 9, Bethel's Admission Office and Office of Diversity and Inclusion partnered with six local colleges to host Hispanic Day for area high school students. About 350 students and chaperones were on campus to learn about college planning, financial aid and student life, and to hear from a panel of local Hispanic and Latino college students.

Education Department Hosts Cadet Teacher Day 3

The Education Department hosted "Cadet Teacher Day" for high school juniors and seniors who are considering a career in education. About 50 local students learned about teaching strategies, observed our onsite Lab Kindergarten (pictured), and talked with faculty and students, all while experiencing Bethel's campus and hearing about our academic programs. The idea for this event was developed using the BIG (Bethel Innovation Gateway) project pipeline, a peer-led process designed to implement innovative projects on campus.

Gardner Field Dedicated 5

In March, a celebration was held for the naming of the softball facility to the Therese & John Gardner Field. The Gardners, pictured with President Chenoweth, are long-time supporters of





the college, and John serves on Bethel's Board of Trustees. "Bethel College is so very grateful to John and Therese Gardner for their many years of generous support of the college's mission," said Steve Matteson, Ph.D., former interim vice president for institutional advancement. "They were instrumental in transforming the college's main entrance on the west side of campus, and now we celebrate their contribution in transforming the entrance on the east side, which includes the softball stadium. We are honored by their investment in our students and in the beauty of our grounds."

Bethel Receives Best Value Award

For the third year in a row, Bethel has been selected out of nearly 8,000 postsecondary schools as the recipient of a Best Value School award. The award is issued by University Research & Review (URR), a company dedicated to improving the process of how a student selects a postsecondary school. The committee that reviewed more than 100 nominees out of the thousands of eligible schools is made up of former university presidents, CEOs, provosts and professors. Schools cannot pay to receive the award; it has to be earned through the nomination and committee evaluation process. Bethel was chosen by the committee because it passed rigorous standards, including a combination of cost, accreditation, variety and quality of school programs, and student satisfaction with the institution.

Bethel College Ranked No. 2, No. 44 on Washington Monthly Lists

Washington Monthly has ranked Bethel College No. 2 of 364 colleges in the Midwest on its 2017 list of the "Best Bang for the Buck Colleges." Bethel was also ranked No. 44 of 632 national colleges and universities on Washington Monthly's 2017 list of "Top Master's Universities." The guide ranks schools based on what they are doing for the country, not just on measures of money and prestige. The "Best Bang for the Buck" list rates colleges that are doing the best job of helping non-wealthy students attain marketable degrees at affordable prices. Schools on the "Top Master's Universities" list are chosen for their contribution to the public good in three categories: social mobility, research and service.

Education Department Nationally Ranked

College Choice recently ranked Bethel No. 27 in the nation on its list of "Best Elementary Education Degrees for 2017." Criteria for the ranking included reputation, affordability and specific program ratings, and was based on reports from U.S. News & World Report, the National Center for Education Statistics and the National Council for Teacher Quality. The list included a variety of public and private colleges from across the country.

New Bethel Students Serve the Community 6

About 300 Bethel freshmen and transfer students served the community as part of their First Year Experience (FYE) orientation by helping the Mishawaka Parks and Recreation Department clean portions of the Mishawaka Riverwalk. This is a tradition for new students, emphasizing Bethel's mission to "equip the whole person for lifelong service," and is part of the more than 22,000 hours of community service that Bethel students volunteer through Michiana each year. Bethel's annual all-college service day was Oct. 3.

Pastors Pray Over Campus 7

On Aug. 25, several groups of pastors gathered around campus to pray over students, faculty and staff as they began a new academic year. The groups walked and prayed over campus, concluding at the Everest-Rohrer Auditorium, where many stayed for the first chapel service of the semester.

Ham Publishes 30th Book of Piano Arrangements **1**

Associate Professor of Music and Artist-in-Residence Marilynn Ham will publish her 30th book of piano arrangements in March 2018. A Glorious Gospel Celebration will be a collection of Southern gospel favorites, including "Since Jesus Came Into My Heart," "Look and Live," "God Leads Us Along," "Ring the Bells of Heaven" and "What a Day That Will Be." Ham chose pieces that are favorites of her parents and friends of their generation. "I've played many pieces of this style over my life, so some of the ideas were already in my head, and I wrote the book in just two months," she says. "It gave me something to pour my thoughts into after the passing of my husband. I know he would be happy I started to write again."

Faculty, Students and Alumni Publish Articles

Bethel senior **Kathryn Weaver '18** was the first author on "Using a health-rating system to evaluate the usefulness of Caenorhabditis elegans as a model for anthelmintic study," published in PLOS ONE. Assistant Professor of Biology **Cassandra May, Ph.D. 12**, and Assistant Professor of Biology **Brian Ellis, Ph.D. 13** were co-authors. Ellis praised Weaver's efforts, noting that, "Publishing a paper as the first author in a peer-reviewed biomedical journal, as an undergraduate student, is a rare accomplishment."

Lauren Cox '14, Lauren Crump '14 and Renee Struwing '14, three nursing alumni, were co-authors of an article that presented research they conducted while studying abroad in the Dominican Republic during their time as students. Rev. Mark and Sheryl Douras are connected to Bethel College in way that has touched them deeply. Both of their children, Jonathan (attended '02-'05) and Elizabeth '07, chose Bethel. And it was at Bethel that their son, Jonathan, made friends, played music and searched for his career path, before a cancer diagnosis changed the family's plans.

When both kids were in college, Mark and Shervl, who had led short-term mission trips

domestically and abroad, decided it was a good time to take their most extended mission trip ever – as full-time missionaries in Russia. Mark had taught, worked with youth and conducted leadership training in St. Petersburg, as a guest teacher for a period of years.

With Jonathan and Elizabeth entering college at Bethel, Sheryl says, "we knew Bethel would be a good, safe place for them."

Just five months after they arrived in

Russia, Jonathan was diagnosed with cancer.
The couple returned home and moved to
Mishawaka to be close during treatments and
Sheryl taught at Bethel as adjunct faculty.

Jonathan had been at Bethel two-and-a-half years when he passed away in 2005. He loved music, playing several instruments and was a member of the college choir.

Jonathan and Elizabeth both had participated in short-term mission trips before college. "I think those trips gave Jonathan a real passion to work with kids overseas," Mark says.

As a way to honor their son's life and passions, the Jonathan M. Douras Memorial Missions Task Force Fund was established.

Mark and Sheryl receive thank you cards and letters from scholarship recipients expressing their gratitude for the opportunity to fulfill their dreams and expand their education. Jonathan's life connected his family to Bethel in a special way. Through his scholarship, he can continue to impact students for a long time.

"It is a privilege to have this scholarship. We admire Bethel's mission," Mark says. "Not just the mission, but how it is implemented," he added.

In 2018, Mark and Sheryl Douras will open Refreshing Mercies Ministry, a place for those experiencing grief or loss, inspired by the loss of their son. Through shared meals, creative expression projects, and guided journaling activities, people will have opportunity to grow closer to God and heal.

"When you lose someone, there are significant anniversary dates ... there is a need to get away, focus and let God speak," Mark says.

The facility will include a chapel and outdoor spaces conducive to prayer and meditation. They will host one family at a time for two-night stays, or groups up to eight individuals for retreats. They will also offer support for pastors or missionaries who are transitioning to new roles and places or who are experiencing burnout.

"There are so many different kinds of loss," Mark says. "Even a loss of dreams. We want people to experience healing," Mark says.

"At Bethel I was very quiet and shy. I was afraid to speak to people," says Galvan, originally from Mexico. He would have never guessed his career would lead him to public speaking.

He studied information technology (IT) at Bethel, but his passion was for soccer. Galvan played with current Head Coach Thiago Pinto '05, '07, and was greatly influenced by then coach Pablo Rodriguez '99, '02, who helped develop him as a soccer player.

After graduation, he played semi-professional soccer in England, with hopes of becoming a professional player, but eventually landed a job in IT.

"To be honest, I wasn't in love with that," he says. "I decided to do what I love and am good at – I wanted to serve."

So, at the age of 25, he went to Spain to pursue the MBA sports program at Real Madrid University. Through a trip to New York with the university, to see how professional teams in the United States are run, Galvan was introduced to Major League Soccer.

He made the bold move to ask for an interview and landed an internship in New York City, earning just \$500 a month.

"I rented a bed for [about] \$300 a month and used the rest of the money to buy food - I didn't even have

enough money to buy [Major League Soccer] shirts," he says.

Though it was a tough time financially, it paid off when the league offered him a full-time job that launched his career. With Major League Soccer, Galvan traveled internationally and planned large-scale events. He even helped organize the first Pan-Pacific Championship

in Hawaii, which included a special event for soccer celebrity David Beckham. And it was his idea to recruit international players for the league that led to his training business.

"I noticed their performance was going up and down. I noticed that though they were doing well physically, they were still struggling," Galvan says. "So, I tried training them mentally," he says.

His first client was a player from Serbia (Veljko Paunovic), who is now the coach of the Chicago Fire. Since then, he's worked with clients ranging from professional soccer players and coaches to college, high school and club teams.

One concept Galvan uses in training is to grow one percent better each day. "One percent is the difference between winning and losing. One percent is the difference that only one percent are willing to do!" he says.

In the future, Galvan hopes to use his knowledge gained from working with the world of soccer and apply it to the business

world, offering mental performance training to entrepreneurs and businesses.

"The most rewarding thing is that most people tell me it's impossible ... there are all of these obstacles ... when people say they can't do it, I say, people told me the same thing, but I did it. If I can do it, you can do it."

BEHIND THE BUSINESS

The idea behind the business came when Galvan worked for Major League Soccer as an international recruiter for players from Central America, South America and Europe. He noticed a variance in their performance, despite being in top physical condition.

"That's how I started developing Six Pack Mental in 2011. I developed a training program ... I realized that if I really wanted to make a difference, I had to read and study, so I started devouring books on high performance, psychology, nutrition ... I was constantly learning and trying new things. I developed the system, started applying the concepts."

Since then, he has worked with and advised internationally renowned teams like the Mexican National Team, Real Madrid University, Major League Soccer and U.S. Soccer. He's also worked with players and coaches who have participated in a FIFA World Cup, Champions League, La Liga, LigaMX, MLS, NASL and college and youth academies.



VAULTING TO VICTORY

Junior Danielle (Dani) Wojciechowski '19, a physical and health education major, has made an indelible mark on the women's track and field team. In her first season as a Bethel Pilot, the transfer student from Roselle, III., claimed not one but two NAIA national championships in the women's pole vault (both indoor and outdoor).

She became the first women's track and field athlete in Bethel history to win an individual national title and the first athlete in the history of the program to capture multiple titles. Additionally, she finished the season as a four-time all-American, Crossroads League Champion and five-time Crossroads League Women's Field Athlete of the Week, and set both indoor and outdoor women's pole vault records for the Pilots.

But she hasn't let the success go to her head. She sees it as a platform to share with others about her college and her faith.

With a background in gymnastics and springboard diving, Wojciechowski took up pole vaulting in high school, finding a new kind of thrill in propelling her body into the air and feeling, just for a moment, like she could fly.

She relies on muscle memory and trusts her coaches when attempting to clear a higher bar, but credits much of her success to a rigorous training program. This includes conditioning, heavy lifting and sprinting, in addition to actually jumping. In fact, she stayed close to campus over the summer so she could continue training with her coaches.

"Danny [Wilkerson] and JW [Maierle] have really invested in me. They are very serious and focused," Wojciechowski says. "Bethel probably has one of the best coaching staffs in the country for track and field. When I first came, [head] coach Tony Natali made me feel right at home."

Looking to the 2017-18 season, Wojciechowski feels pressure to repeat her performance from last season, but stays motivated by focusing on her season verse: Hebrews 2:11. "Discipline is not fun but produces results," she paraphrases.

"For me, I love the sport and I have so much fun doing it - the success is just the cherry on top," Wojciechowski says.

Women's Basketball

Eric Gingerich returns for his second season as women's basketball head coach, following a 10-21 debut last season. Alex Daniel is the lone returning assistant coach. Lightfoot will bring on Andrew Wingreen from Bob Jones University to serve as an assistant coach and former Notre Dame great and NBA All-Rookie honoree LaPhonso Ellis to serve as a special assistant coach. In addition, Lady Pilots Basketball Assistant Coach Ryan Ehm will join the program as a graduate assistant this season. The new coaching staff will guide senior Gage Ott, and juniors Paul Forman and Luke Fisher, among others, to defend their Crossroads League championships.



MAKING SPACE FOR CONTINUITY

Michelle (Ferris) FitzGerald '09 is not what you would call a traditional teacher. Yes, she spent four years teaching middle school students in South Bend Community Schools and had once imagined herself educating students in other countries. But a few years ago, the strong desire to find herself as an artist led her to explore new art forms and eventually open a business where she could grow her own skills, while supporting others to do the same. Make South Bend was founded on the idea of educating people, while helping them build confidence and self-esteem.

"It felt like our artists were secluded and neglected. I wanted to see a community of supportive, collaborating artists and makers who would encourage and challenge each other to be better," says FitzGerald.

In the community of River Park (just down the street from Bethel), FitzGerald teaches classes, hires experts to teach, and opens up new experiences to students young and old.

Her studio perpetuates the ideology of the Maker Movement - encouraging and empowering people to make anything - and is evident in her classes that range from textiles to 3D printing. She also rents private studio space to artists.

Raised in a creative home, FitzGerald says her business idea came after sketching jewelry and needing a way to laser cut designs into wood. In that moment, she realized others might have the same need for shared space and equipment.

Beyond fulfilling her desire to create and teach, her endeavor

helps her live out her life statement, written in the class of Associate Professor of Communication Elizabeth McLaughlin, Ph.D.: "To create and restore dignity in others, through love, service and education."

"I can serve people and give them valuable skills and be part of their lives, just by having this space and continuing to meet with them. This is a way I can do ministry."

While she accomplished this as a schoolteacher, her business enables her to reach more people of all ages.

An English major at Bethel, she served as a tutor in the writing center, and as editor for The Beacon. As she was considering pursuing TESOL (Teaching English to Speakers of Other





Languages), she did a semester abroad trip to the Dominican Republic. Placed at an art school, she witnessed firsthand how art, education and evangelism can meld.

This idea of using art to reach people for Jesus was appealing and something FitzGerald carried with her when she established

Make South Bend.

"I can serve people and give them valuable skills and be part of their lives, just by having this space and continuing to meet with them. This is a way I can do ministry."

She and her husband, Nat FitzGerald '09 (Christian Ministries), feel called to stay in South Bend. He is the worship leader at Northpoint Vineyard Church, which the couple helped plant four years ago.

From the study abroad experience and her other travels, she has come to appreciate her hometown.

"Most importantly, it reinforced to me that you can serve in your community and love where you are."

For the future, FitzGerald plans to build on her original vision of creating a space for connections to happen and hopes to welcome more people in her newly expanded class space, or to the retail space featuring the work of more than 30 local artists.

"When I quit my job teaching, it was definitely a step of faith and I didn't know what I would do, but there was peace around it – so I felt like God was in that," she says. "I really think as I look back, there were a lot of things that kept us going – and I can't explain it – but God had His hand on it somehow."







Here are some examples of the GREAT momentum building on campus as we strive to become GREATer, for the greater glory of God.



G: GROW

- In April, the Genesians, Bethel's traveling drama troupe, held two performances of "The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe" on campus for area schools and homeschool groups. More than 1,000 students and teachers attended.
- Bethel's Admission Office and Office of Diversity and Inclusion partnered with six local colleges to host Hispanic Day on May 9 with about 350 students and chaperones in attendance.
- The Education Department hosted "Cadet Teacher Day" on March 23. for high school juniors and seniors considering a career in education. About 50 local students learned about teaching strategies, observed our onsite Lab Kindergarten, and talked with faculty and students, all while experiencing Bethel's campus and hearing about our academic programs.



R: REVIVAL

- Bethel students, faculty and staff served at home and abroad this summer. Four task force teams travelled to Thailand and Myanmar, Guatemala, Alaska and the Dominican Republic; the Admission LEAD team served as counselors at summer camps.
- In August, community worship opportunities included: a faculty
 and staff worship and communion service; a foot-washing
 ceremony for student leaders; and a pastor prayer walk on
 campus, followed by the first chapel service of the year.
- In September, members of the Women's Soccer Team traveled to Houston, Texas, to serve those affected by Hurricane Harvey. They partnered with Bethel alumni LJ Evers and Joe Hutchinson, who work for the Keystone Project in Houston, to deliver supplies and help the nonprofit provide disaster relief.



E: ENCORE

- To help new students get off to a great start with their Bethel experience, the Student Life team created a video and app to help students and their families know what to expect for Welcome Week activities in August.
